What is offered in KAI Homestay Program?

- KAI Homestay Program offers students a chance to meet and live with Japanese families who are interested in cultural exchange and language learning.
- The host families have been carefully chosen by KAI' s selection procedures. Our staffs visit all the families to make sure they can provide a comfortable housing for students.
- Morning and evening meals are included in the price.
- A private room suitable for study is available.
- Amenities such as towels, sheets, soap and shampoo are provided.
- Commuting time to the school is between 30 minutes and 1.5 hours.
- Once you start your home stay, our staff will communicate with you and your host family to make sure everything is going well and that you are having a comfortable stay.

Homestay application procedures



- 1 Send your homestay inquiry along with your course application. We will then send you a homestay application form. Fill in the form and send it back to us.
- 2 We will introduce you a host family best suited for you.
- 3 Once the matching is worked out, you will be asked to remit the fees.
- 4 Once we have confirmed your payment, we will send you a booking confirmation with all the details.
